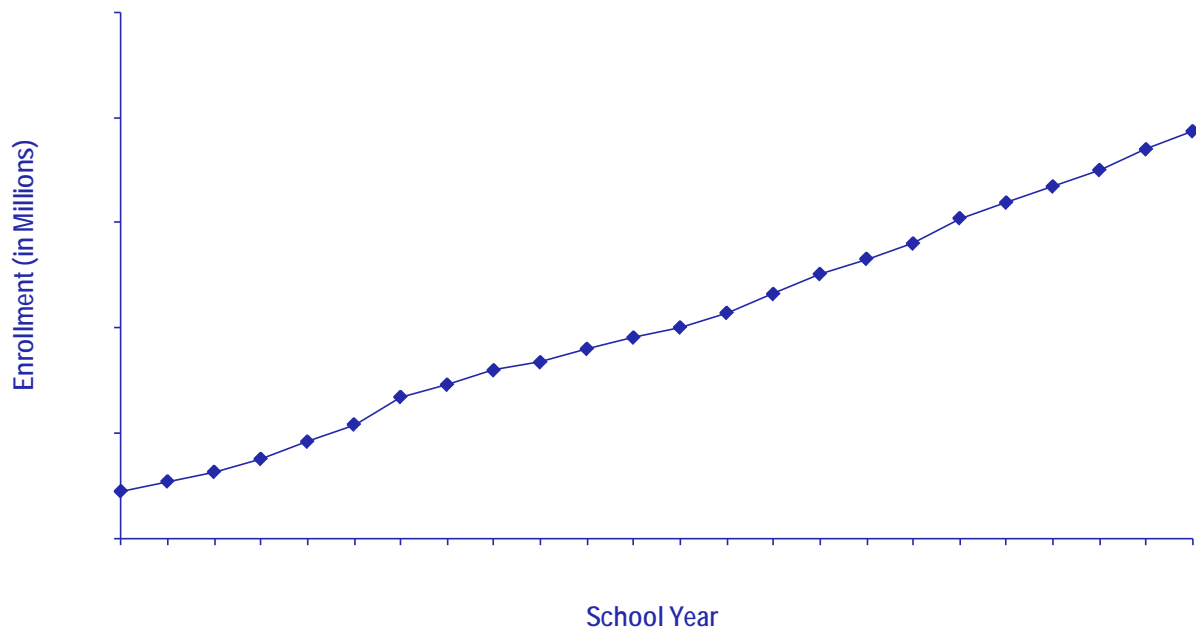

Total enrollment in 2000-01 was 4,071,433. (Table 2). By 2010-11, enrollment had risen to 4,933,617. Over the 10-year period, average annual enrollment increased by 862,184, or 21.2 percent.

State enrollment in 1987-88 was 3,224,916. By 2010-11, enrollment had risen to 4,933,617.

Over the 23-year period between 1987-88 and 2010-11, average annual enrollment increased by 1,708,701, or 53.0 percent (Table 3).

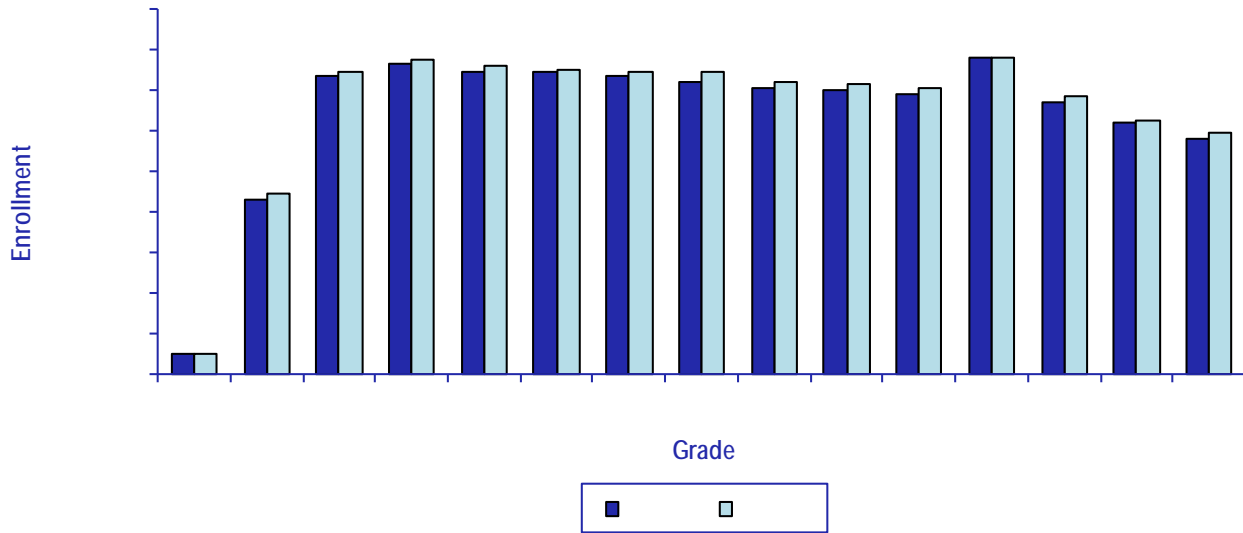

Dropouts in 2009-10 and 2010-11 decreased, Grade 9 and 10 enrollment increased (Figure 4 and Table 9), as a result of the state's efforts to increase Grade 9 enrollment (TEA, 2010b). In 2010-11, a total of 390,665 students were enrolled in Grade 9.

Across Grade K-12 in 2010-11, the average number of students enrolled in each grade increased from 6.0 in 2009-10 to 7.9 in 2010-11.

Between 2009-10 and 2010-11, enrollment in each grade increased, with the largest increase in Grade 9, which saw an increase of 1,375 students.

Enrollment by Grade and Economically Disadvantaged Status

The percentage of economically disadvantaged students enrolled between 2009-10 and 2010-11 increased from 58.9 percent to 59.1 percent (Table 12). While the percentage of economically disadvantaged students enrolled in grade 3, 4, and 12 decreased, the percentage of economically disadvantaged students enrolled in grades 1 and 2 increased.

The percentage of economically disadvantaged students enrolled in grade 1 and grade 12 (Figure 7 and Table 12), a trend that has been observed since 2001-02 and 2010-11 (TEA, 2003, 2005, 2007, 2009a, 2009b, 2010a). In 2010-11, 63.5 percent of economically disadvantaged students were enrolled in grade 1 and 45.1 percent were enrolled in grade 12.

As of the end of 2010-11, the percentage of economically disadvantaged students who are female is 88.0 percent, a trend that has been observed since 2001-02.

The percentage of students who are identified as students with disabilities is 39.5 percent for the 2000-01 and 2010-11 (Table 13, page 24).

Between the years 2000-01 and 2010-11, the percentage of students who are identified as students with disabilities increased from 1.2 percent to 1.2 percent. The percentage of students who are identified as students with disabilities in 2010-11 (66.2%) is the same as the percentage of students who are identified as students with disabilities in 2000-01.

According to the data, the percentage of students who are identified as students with disabilities is 57.7 percent for the 2000-01 and 2010-11 (Table 13, page 24).

As a result of the 2010-11 school year, the percentage of students enrolled in instructional programs and special populations by race/ethnicity is shown in Table 14 (Table 14).

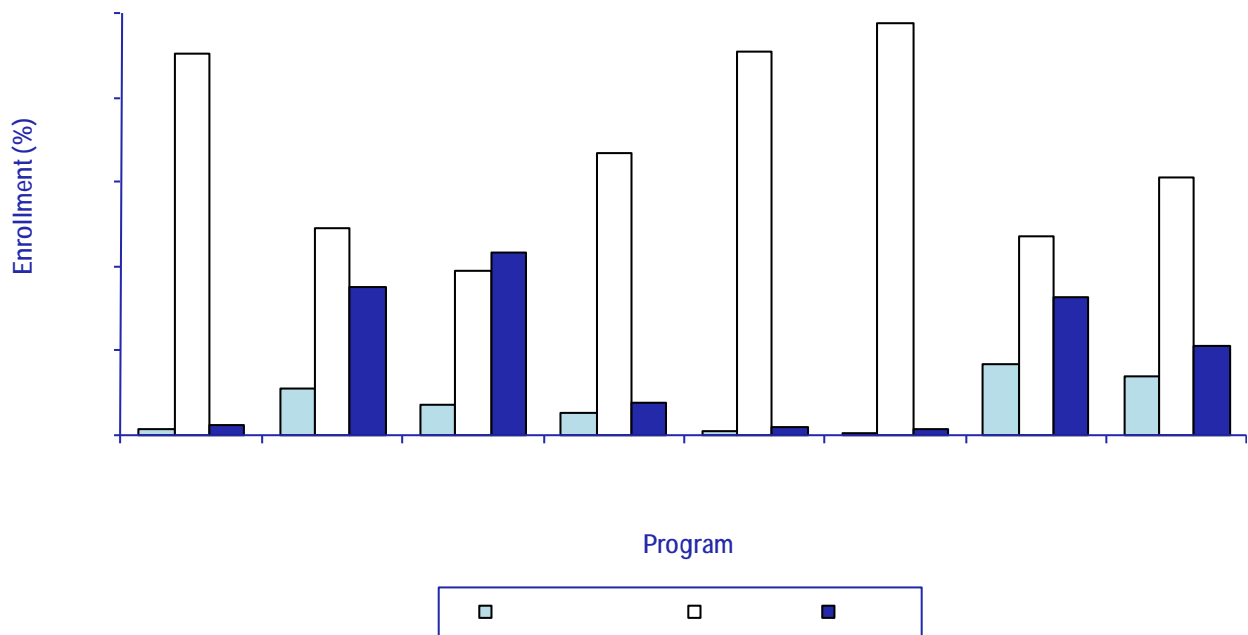
In 2010-11, African American students accounted for 12.9 percent of the total enrollment in instructional programs and special populations, compared to 16.7 percent of the total enrollment in instructional programs and special populations in 2009-10 (Table 14).

In 2010-11, Hispanic students accounted for 39.0 percent of the total enrollment in instructional programs and special populations, compared to 50.3 percent of the total enrollment in instructional programs and special populations in 2009-10 (61.2 percent). Caucasian students accounted for 43.4 percent of the total enrollment in instructional programs and special populations in 2010-11, compared to 31.2 percent of the total enrollment in instructional programs and special populations in 2009-10 (21.3 percent).

District 2000-01, ESC Region 4 (Houston). The enrollment rate of students aged 5 to 17, 21.6 percent, is above the national average (Table 17 and 34). In 2010-11, Region 4 continued to see a decline in enrollment rate (22.1%).

In 2000-01, Region 9 (Waco/Fort Worth) had an enrollment rate of 1.0 percent for students aged 5 to 17. Region 9's enrollment rate in 2010-11, 0.8 percent, is below the national average.

Region 13 (Austin) experienced a decline in enrollment rate from 2000-01 to 2010-11, from 37.8 percent (Figure 12 and Table 17 and 34). Region 5 (Beaumont) also experienced a decline, from 6.5 percent to 5.5 percent.

National Enrollment Trends

The table below shows the percentage of children (ages 5-17) and children ages 12-17 who are in school. The data is from the U.S. Census Bureau (U.S. Census Bureau, 2000, 2010). From 1999 to 2009, the percentage of children ages 5-17 in school increased from 20.0% to 24.8%. The percentage of children ages 12-17 in school increased from 12.6% to 18.2% over the same period. The percentage of children ages 5-17 who are in school is 4.1 percentage points higher than the percentage of children ages 12-17 who are in school.

Special Education (LEP) enrollment rates in 2008-09 were 15.0% in Texas, 10.6% in California, 7.5% in Florida, and 5.0% in New York. In 1998-99, Texas (15.0%) and California (10.6%) had the highest enrollment rates, followed by Florida (7.5%) and New York (5.0%).
